LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR, REV. STEVE STEWART

What actually is a "Christian"?...

Down the years, survey after survey has shown that many people – perhaps the majority of British people – believe the UK to be a "Christian" country. There is no doubt that certain aspects of our legal and constitutional system in the UK owe some sort of debt to the values of a Christianised historical tradition.

In addition, visit any town, city or country village, and there you will find parish churches with a particularly recognisable architecture – be that Norman Romanesque, mediaeval Gothic, Tudor, Renaissance, Baroque, Gothic revival or modernist.

Also, our musical heritage, be it from Mozart and Handel to gospel blues is woven into the soundscape of much of British history.

But this heritage, however "Christian" we may describe it, actually tells us very little about what it means to be a Christian. After all, Christianity is a phenomenon existed long before the cultural heritage to which it gave birth. Christianity was born at a different time in a different culture in a different country. There is nothing specifically "British" about Christianity. It is a worldwide phenomenon, transcending culture, time and geography.

So what does it mean to be a "Christian"? Well, the clue is in the name: a Christian is a follower of Jesus *Christ*. But not just somebody who recognises that Jesus had some good things to say, or enjoys reading the Bible (where we find out about Jesus), or acknowledges that Jesus was a real historical person.

A Christian is somebody who believes that Jesus is the Christ. That this person named "Jesus" was the divine son of God, sent into the world to take the punishment for the bad things you and I have done and thought and said, and that he did so by dying on the cross. And that he was resurrected to life on the third day. In short, a Christian is somebody who believes that the things which the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) tell us about Jesus are true. That the Gospels are a faithful witness to Jesus' identity, mission, death and resurrection. Believing anything less than this means that a person is not a Christian.

But here's the lovely thing: Christianity is not a restricted group of people. Coming to faith in Christ is open to anyone – even me, even you. And that means our churches are always a place where you will receive a warm welcome to our worship services, whether you believe or not. Our services are a place of fellowship, where you will hear the truth about Jesus Christ and learn of his infinite love for you.

That person may value highly all sorts of things about our Christian heritage. They may be good people and in some way morally upright, and they may even like church architecture and the music of Handel, but they are not Christians.

One thing which the Bible notes about Christians, from almost as soon as Jesus had risen from the dead, is that they met together weekly. It is this that gave birth to the church we know today, and it is why the Christians in your villages still meet week by week to worship the risen Jesus.

20mph Scheme





LITTLE FREE LIBRARY NEWS

What is a Little Free Library? At its heart, it's a place for you to swap books: take a book, leave a book. Of course, you don't have to give books in order to take books, and you don't need to return them, either.

Most of the books we receive are in great condition, and they soon get taken by other people. There are some, however, that really are better suited to the



recycling bin: books with torn or dirty pages; yellowed or faded with age; dusty and mouldy; or simply so old and tattered that no-one is going to take them, no matter how wonderful the content might be. If you have unwanted books like this, please recycle them rather than donating them to the Little Free Library. Thank you.

There is another category of books that cause us problems: we frequently find large numbers of old, out-of-date historical or non-fiction reference books that have been left at the Little Free Library by the Village Hall. These books really are unsuitable for us, because they are usually on specialised topics that are of little interest to the general public. What happens to these books? Our volunteers have to carry them home and then later drive them to the few charity shops that will accept them. Please make it easier for everyone by taking books like these directly to a charity shop or specialised used bookshop, where they are more likely to be appreciated by someone. Thank you for your understanding.

GOVERNMENT CUTS IN WINTER FUEL PAYMENTS

The Government is cutting the winter fuel payment for pensioners who do not qualify for pension credit and many people are worried about being able to afford their energy bills this winter.

Many eligible pensioners have not claimed the pension credit that they are entitled to, but the application form is long and off-putting. Check the website

https://www.gov.uk/pension-credit/eligibility

The winter fuel payment isn't the only option for managing bills. Have a look at the regulator **ofgem.gov.uk** website where a guide lists all the grants and schemes available. The website also sets out what you can expect your energy supplier to do if you call and say that you can't afford your bills.

The <u>Priority Services Register</u> is a free service where you can get additional support with a utility bill, not just gas and electricity. Your age and disability may qualify you to go on the register, but many others may also be able to get help, depending on their needs.

Contact your energy supplier and say you want to go on the register. Once on, the energy firm must prioritise your situation and make allowances for the expenses relating to your specific needs. If a firm knows that a customer is on the register, it must also provide help and assistance if bills are not affordable.

Suppliers should offer a tailored plan to support vulnerable customers. Ofgem recommends steps such as reviewing payments, offering payment breaks or reductions, extending payment deadlines, providing access to hardship funds, and giving advice on cutting energy usage.

Energy firms also have energy or heating grants for customers. Apply through the energy firm to see if you qualify.

The government's Warm Home Discount Scheme is due to reopen in October 2024. This is a discount applied directly to energy bills. You can find out more at

These schemes and discounts can be overwhelming. If you need help, charities such as Scope and Citizens Advice can tell you about the benefits and help that you might qualify for.

If you have explored all the options above, the **Eynsham Consolidated Charity** may be able to offer some help to applicants who live in Eynsham and Freeland.

Eynsham Consolidated Charity provides small to medium sized grants to people living in the Parishes of Eynsham or Freeland who need financial help.



ARE YOU A PENSIONER?

You could be entitled to a Winter Fuel Payment.

Are you eligible? HOW TO CLAIM PENSION CREDIT.

Pension credit is complicated, so rather than trying to work out if you can get it, you can use the Government's free Pension Credit Calculator via the .gov.uk website.

To do this it is easiest if you have details of your current earnings, benefits and pensions to hand (for you and your partner if you live with them). It will then give you an instant estimate of how much you are due.

If you would rather talk to someone, there is a free government **helpline** you can call. Again it is best to have your details to hand. In England, the pension service helpline is **0800 731 0469**

HOW DO I APPLY IF I AM ELIGIBLE?

To claim, you can either do so **online at gov.uk** or call the **pension credit claim line** on **0800 99 1234**, and they can fill the application in for you over the phone. (Lines are open Monday to Friday, 8am to 6pm).

You will need the following information about you and your partner if you have one.

- National Insurance number
- Information about any income, savings and investments on the date you want to backdate your application to. (This is usually three months ago or the date you reached state pension age).
- You will also need your bank account details.
- Depending on how you apply, you may also be asked for your bank or building society name, sort code and account number.
