LETTER FROM OUR ASSOCIATE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

Amazing grace! How sweet the sound, That saved a wretch; like me! I once was lost, but now am found, Was blind, but now I see

As I am sure most readers will recognize, the above quote is the first verse of the well-known hymn Amazing Grace, written by the former slaver John Newton in 1779. Its message of forgiveness, restoration, and transformation has genuinely stood the test of time. Various musicians have recorded it more than 7,000 times, including Elvis Presley, Andrea Bocelli, Whitney Houston, and even U2.

What makes this hymn so unique is the authenticity of the lyrics written by John Newton, who before his conversion to Christianity, was actively involved in the slave trade. John Newton was converted to Christianity in 1748 when he called out to God for mercy when his vessel was in the middle of a violent storm off the coast of County Donegal, Ireland. While this encounter with God marked the beginning of his journey of faith, it was not until several years later, when he began to study Christian theology that he became an abolitionist. He wrote the words to Amazing Grace in 1773 to illustrate a New Year's Day sermon, although the tune as we know it was not added until later.

What is so amazing about the hymn 'Amazing Grace' is that it captures the good news about Jesus in a few lines: forgiveness and restoration are possible regardless of who we are or what we have done, and God's love and mercy are available to everyone.

Chris Tomlin, a Christian musician, produced an excellent version of this hymn for the film Amazing Grace, about the abolition of the slave trade. Despite our busy lives, my encouragement is to take a five-minute break, click the link below (or search for 'Chris Tomlin, Amazing Grace') listen to the song or watch the music video, and allow the creator of the universe to remind us of his forgiveness, his love, and his grace to each one of us.



Hedges, grass and overgrown issues

20mph Scheme

After the public consultation held by **Oxfordshire County Council** the speed limit through the **centre of the village** is being reduced **down to 20mph**. The speed limit on the **A4095** will stay at **40mph** as far as Long Hanborough where it drops down to **30mph**.

Defibrillators

We are very lucky to have two defibrillators in our village. One is located by Freeland Primary School in the old telephone box. The other is located on the left hand side of the Freeland Village Hall entrance porch. The Warm Home Energy Day - 14th September

If you spotted children with sparkly flowers and one boy with a very impressive snake, on their faces, on Saturday 14th September in the village, well these were visitors to Freeland's first Warm Home Energy Day.

Along with their families they were able to collect draught busting samples from the Low Carbon Hub stall, find out about grants and advice about making homes warmer and sustainable from the County Council retro-fit consultant and also ask their neighbours about how they chose their solar panels. FEG appreciates and thanks everyone for all the work and contributions made on the day - not only from our members and families, but also those from the representatives of Low Carbon Hub, Oxfordshire County Council and especially not forgetting the local neighbours who volunteered to chat about their experience in creating their own electricity.

It was a lovely sunny day, not the ideal perhaps to get people thinking about winter warmth, however over 60 people dropped in for information over a cup of tea, a round of the Grid Game or trying out the thermal imaging camera.

West Oxfordshire District Council was represented at the event by Liberal Democrat Councillor, Lidia Arciszewska and Roger Faulkner, the Conservative District Councilor also for Freeland and Hanborough. The draw was made for the three full house energy surveys (each worth £600). The Eynsham company 'Curiosity Box' owner donated and made the draw for the prizes of a science box for each of the two winners for the children's competition to name the 'snuggled up house'.

This was the first Warm Home Day we've held; the first step for many in working towards the community plan for net zero (CAPZero). If you would like to be more involved and join the FEG please do get in touch with:






