LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR, REV. STEVE STEWART:

A most unlikely Victor!...



Watching the Olympics this summer, I was struck particularly by some of the unlikely victors. Like the USA gold medallist Cole Hocker who came from behind to produce a sensational shock win over GB's Josh Kerr and Norwegian Jakob Ingebrigtsen in the men's 1500m. In the Bible it talks about Jesus having the victory. And all this got me thinking what an extraordinary, even sensational thing Christianity is.

In the ancient world of Jesus' time, everyone except the Jews believed in a multitude of gods, with new gods being added from time to time. If you were a Jew, you believed in one god. If you believed in one god, you were a Jew! The Gentiles (the non-Jews) variously hated Jews for "monotheism", mocked them for it, and very occasionally admired them for it.

Another thing which made the Jews seem unusual to the Gentiles was that their God was utterly *unseen*: no statues, no images, no idols. To the Gentiles, this seemed ridiculous. But imageless worship was so important for ancient Jews, that when pressed to do otherwise, they would protest, fight, and even go to war over the issue.

The Gentiles on the other hand were happy enough with having many gods, lots of images and idols, and even having humans as gods such as the Caesars and Emperors.

Indeed, of all the ancient religions, there was none harder than Judaism into which to introduce a divine, God-come-as-a-man messiah: Jesus Christ came in the flesh! But Christianity was *born* in Judaism, was *propagated* by Jews (such as Peter, Paul, James and John), and *grew* first within Judaism. This could not have happened within Judaism – and indeed never has happened – except in the case of Jesus Christ.

It is even more bizarre then that: there is no other world religion that has successfully claimed or proclaimed a bodily resurrected God-man Messiah. That this happened within, of all religions, *Judaism* is utterly incredible!

For such a thing to take place within Judaism ,would take a cataclysmic, seismic, tectonic, and indeed miraculous event. And that event was the Resurrection of Jesus. Nothing less than that could possibly account for the emergence of Christianity within ancient Judaism. All other explanations less than the Resurrection are insufficient.

The reason that the Resurrection is at the heart of Christians' hope and the hope for the world is that it is *God's* Resurrection, *God's* intervention and the evidence of *God's* promise.





WILDLIFE CORRIDOR

In the August edition of 'Grapevine', part of my response in the section "Nature Recovery and Wildlife Conservation" in the recently held village survey was printed.

Among my proposals was that the 'Wildlife Corridor', stretching from Pinsley Wood, Church Hanborough, along Pigeon House Lane, over Wroslyn Road along Lime Avenue to Cuckoo Lane should be recognised to support important habitats and provide lasting protection for wildlife. In part, I was responding to the little known Montréal Global Biodiversity framework, produced by the United Nations in **December 2020.** The UK was one of **169** countries to sign up to this agreement, to halt the continuing loss of nature and promising that by **2030** our government will ensure that **30%** of our land and seas will be managed for nature. Latest research suggests that at present no more than **5%** of land in the UK is managed in this way, mainly by organisations such as the RSPB and the National Trust. The Office for Environmental Protection (OEP), in January of this year, reported that we need to accelerate our efforts to restore, protect and enhance the environment if the targets are to be met. The question is: Can we, the people of Freeland and Church Hanborough, play some part in achieving these aims to support wildlife in our villages?

My plan for the Wildlife Corridor was made in response to this challenge and my belief that it will be local schemes, devised, supported, and maintained by local people, that provide the framework for achieving that goal. We do not want or need top-down schemes from government, provided by people with little knowledge of the local environment, to be imposed upon us. If we go ahead ourselves, we can provide a blueprint for similar schemes elsewhere.

A key site in the Wildlife Corridor is Chapel Meadow, with its abundance of wildlife which must be protected. When I made my suggestion, it was under the belief that Chapel Meadow was safe from development as the planning application from Spitfire Homes had been rejected in 2023 and had not been taken to appeal. Unfortunately, I was under that misapprehension, but I still believe that the plan for the Wildlife Corridor should not be abandoned. My view is that Chapel Meadow is so essential for wildlife that it must be safeguarded. From feedback that I've already received from residents in Freeland and Church Hanborough, I know that there is support for such a scheme.

Should you agree that the Wildlife Corridor plan has merit, then please inform your Parish and District Counsellors of your support. You might even contact our recently elected MP to see if he has any plan for, or cares about wildlife in his constituency.

On **Sunday 8th September** volunteers will be giving free talks at the museum on "The Ups and Downs in the Development of the Bicycle" and "Reducing bus heights to fit under Oxford Railway Bridge" as part of the 2024 national Heritage Open Days celebration. On Heritage Open Days there are lots of places to visit, many not usually open to the public like the Old Ticket Office at Culham Station, special exhibitions at museums such as "Tube Exhibit Journeys" at The Rumble Museum in Cheyney School and others at the Witney and District and the Aston Martin Heritage Museums.

This month we look back 100 years to 1924. Such was the popularity of buses, that in the mid-1920s City of Oxford Motor Services (COMS) needed more capacity. This was achieved by building new bodies for existing chassis with more seating. The reconfigured seats on both decks faced forward.

The pictured number 46 was a Daimler Y type with its new 1924 body, probably made by COMS. Note the full-width windscreen for the driver. Initially the police refused to licence buses with windscreens because the drivers' view would be restricted. In London the police withdrew their opposition to windscreens only in the late 1920s. This bus had solid tyres in 1924, although they were later replaced with pneumatic tyres before 1932, when this group of buses was taken out of service.


